From the Pastor's desk:

Jesus announced the mission and vision of the church at the end of his earthly ministry. Weeks after his resurrection and appearance to hundreds, he instructed the disciples to meet him in Galilee.

Matthew 28:16 Then the eleven disciples went to Galilee, to the mountain where Jesus had told them to go. 17 When they saw him, they worshiped him 18 Then Jesus came to them and said, "All authority in heaven and on earth has been given to me. 19 Therefore, go and make disciples of all nations, 19 baptizing them in the name of the Father and of the Son and of the Holy Spirit, 20 and teaching them to obey everything I have commanded you. And surely I am with you always, to the very end of the age.

With that as our charge, we adopted our current mission statement: We are intentionally making Disciples of Jesus Christ by transforming one person at a time, transforming the community, transforming the world.

In other words, we are to lead people into a growing relationship with Jesus.

Where do we begin? Let's revisit the first chapter of John.

At the beginning of Jesus' ministry, he was on his way to Galilee. He met a young man named Phillip and said, "Follow me. Join me in what I'm doing." Phillip had heard enough and seen enough to know that Jesus was the real deal—"God in human form." He said, "Yes, but can I invite a friend?" He ran and invited Nathanael. A thinker. A skeptic. Not someone who was easy to convince.

45 Philip found Nathanael and told him, "We have found the one Moses wrote about in the Law, and about whom the prophets also wrote—Jesus of Nazareth, the son of Joseph." 46"Nazareth! Can anything good come from there?" Nathanael asked. "Come and see," said Philip.

If I can just get you there . . . If I can just get you in the presence of Jesus of Nazareth. . . And so it should be with J-town church. We are the body of Christ. Come and see, experience, listen. Be changed.

We are on a mission to create "Come-and-see" environments. In order to do that I need your help.

- 1. Pray for the Holy Spirit to come and be a part of everything we do.
- 2. Invite someone to church weekly.
- 3. Intentionally grow in your relationship with God and one another by becoming part of a small group or inviting your friends and families to be a part.
- 4. Commit to serve through the ministry of the church: Kids Café, After school tutoring, Open Door Ministry at Fourth Avenue UMC, the District Habitat House or be trained to be a small group leader.

We are creating environments that captures the attention and imaginations of children, students, and adults.

We are creating environments that would connect people with one another and connect people with their heavenly Father.

Success for us is when:

- Somebody who feels disconnected from God gets involved here and finds his or her connection with God and other Christians.
- Teenagers want to participate.
- Children wake their parents on Sunday morning because they don't want to miss worship.
- Adults feel the freedom to invite friends.
- Every time someone is baptized, we celebrate a changed life.

You are part of transforming people's lives, transforming the community and transforming the world. I love the Church and I know you do, too.

An Invitation From Bill Bowling

Within the local community, it is likely that 50 percent of the people are not active in a church family. Often they consider themselves "spiritual but not religious." These are our children & grandchildren, nieces & nephews. How does God look at these non-religious people? What does God expect churches to do in order to reach them?

Jesus saw himself as a man fishing for people. His fishing was "catch and release." Imagine Jesus catching fish from a small pond filled with scum, silt & algae and then releasing them into the deep, fresh waters of the Kingdom of God. Jesus' call to his first disciples (and still to us today) is, "Come, follow me...and I will send you out to fish for people" (Mark 1:16-18).

The mission of the church is to continue the mission of Jesus. We are meant to continue the search for lost sheep. We are meant to continue to fish for people. And there is incredible joy in finding lost sheep & fishing for people.

This Sunday evening my Group will begin a new study. It is a guide to fishing for people. But finding strays & fishing for people is not merely about technique--it is about cultivating a love for lost sheep and discovering the joy of fishing for people. After an hour of fishing, Drake and his grandpa are heading home. They caught twelve fish altogether. Their hands were a bit smelly; their bodies were a bit sweaty (this happens when you're fishing); but as the boy walked to the car, he turned to his grandpa and said, "That was AWESOME!"

As we rediscover the joy of fishing and see lives changed through the ministry of the church, I suspect you will hear them saying, "That was AWESOME!"
