God's plan doesn't always seem productive (or at least efficient).

Joseph's journey from slave to Egyptian ruler wasn't efficient. Moses waited 80 years before leading the Israelites. In each of these stories, patience was required. Why is it that everyone always says, "just be patient?" Ugh, I don't know about you, but I'm about as patient as a four-year old in Disney. In the beginning of my ministry, I first conceived in my mind that being patient was to passively wait until it happens. Throughout my ministry I have come to realize that patience lived out this way achieves very little or nothing at all.

What I have learned is that there is a big difference between passively being patience and actively being patient (i.e. patiently working hard). At the heart of the gospel and The Great Commission is a responsibility we have to selflessly love, serve, teach, and proclaim. And almost the only way to do this is through the patient nurturing of relationships. Patiently nurturing relationships is patiently working hard. What kind of relationships are we talking about? It is building relationships based on true relevance. True relevance understands culture and responding to hurts and needs with the gospel, sacrificial love, and selfless ministering.

We have tried to understand our relevance within Jeffersontown and have concluded that being a church that feeds people, physically, mentally and spiritually is what God is calling us to do. Two ministries in which we are

currently involved are the Kid's Café, Al-anon and Alateen.

Each Wednesday we feed between 40-50 persons through "Dare to Care." We try to build relationships with the families that we feed. But we need your help... we need persons who would be willing to sit and eat with these families... build and foster relationships with them.

We host Al-anon and Alateen each Monday night... we need persons who will greet them, work with the leaders to set up refreshments and cleanup after their meetings. We want these groups to know that we care and are glad we can provide a place for them to meet.

In ministry, we must fight against the desire to replace relationships entirely with big events, programs, and systems that give the appearance of results. These things are great when built upon a culture that invests in relationships, but without that relational depth, they rarely help people find hope and salvation that only Jesus can give.

Our vision is to make disciples through transforming lives, transforming our community and ultimately transforming the world. Transformation must begin within our own lives.

When making disciples, do we want quantity or quality? God looks at the heart, but pursuing quality is often full of messy ups and downs that feel unproductive and inefficient, therefore patience, actively working in creating relationships that fosters transformation takes time and a whole lot of work...

However, I hope that it doesn't take 80 years. So be patient Steven, be patient Church.
