It's that time of year again, where we arrive at the day we change the time by "falling back" one hour. Getting up on Sunday morning, we are an hour older than we normally are when we arise! For some, it makes for a longer night.

The longest night in history was September 2, 1752, when the Gregorian calendar was adopted in England. The calendar arranged by Julius Caesar, by not making sufficient allowance for leap year, had caused the English date to become 11 days behind the correct time. So to catch up, those days were omitted after September 2nd. The day after September 2nd, in 1752, was reckoned to be September 14th. Now that's what I call "sleeping in!"

We've been experiencing some long days and nights the past eight months. And now as it gets dark earlier and remains so later, fatigue and depression can take over. We're all a bit worn out by this COVID-19 pandemic. I'm tired of it, and I know you are. So how do we not let it get the best of us?

I shared some thoughts about being refreshed in a Sunday message recently. Consider the possibility of adding some of these (or other) activities to our week and see if it doesn't make a little difference in our outlook. They include: more laughter (funny shows or comics, etc.), increased outdoor activity (even though it is getting cooler), return to a long lost hobby or activity of interest (or just help me look for old marbles!), take a day trip somewhere safe, or find a project to finish you've been putting off for some time.

Of course, one of the best things to do is to hone our spiritual disciplines: prayer, scripture, reading, acts of piety and kindness, worship. Maybe pick a book of the Bible and set out to read through it in the weeks ahead. Perhaps take on a mission (write notes of encouragement) or offer something fresh-baked to a neighbor. There are plenty of things to do that could make a difference for someone else, as well as our selves.
