The October 4th worship video will be audio only, with photos & words to the hymns. Also beginning that week we will begin sending out/posting online the weekly worship videos on Wednesdays. This will give us time to include words to the hymns/songs/litanies, etc. to help you be able to participate better.

"Wednesday Wanderings"

The October "Wednesday Wanderings" (monthly outdoor worship), will be held on the 14th, at 6:30 PM on the side lawn (where the stone sign is located). We've moved the date up one week (second Wednesday instead of the third Wednesday of the month), to try and squeeze one in before the weather turns. We will follow the CDC guidelines (asking everyone to stay 6 feet apart, bring a mask and their own lawn chair). Wear a hat or bring an umbrella for shade, and feel free to bring bottled water or soda, if you'd like. This time together will give us an opportunity to see each other (from a distance).

Worship and Music Ministry

It is so interesting to investigate the meaning behind hymns and songs and what inspired the writers or composers. You have heard me share stories that have been passed down through years for some of our favorite classic hymns as well as contemporary worship and praise music. So often, these people are amazing not only in their talent but in translating their real-life inspiration into music for the ages. Such is the case for the hymn "I Know Whom I have Believed" which we will sing in this Sunday's worship (October 4, 2020).

"I Know Whom I Have Believed" was written by Major Daniel Webster Whittle. Daniel Webster Whittle was born on November 22, 1840 in Chicopee Falls, Massachusetts. He was named for the politician and founder of the dictionary, Daniel Webster. Whittle was very religious as a young man and worked as a cashier for Wells Fargo Bank.

In 1861, he joined the Army with a rank of 2nd Lieutenant. The night before leaving for war he married Abbie Hanson. In his own words he tells of his departure, "My dear mother was a devout Christian, and parted from me with many a tear, and followed me with many a prayer. She had placed a New Testament in a pocket of the haversack that she'd arranged for me." He rose to the rank of Major, lost an arm in the war and became a prisoner of war. While a POW, he began to read through the scriptures.

One day, a nurse begged Major Whittle to go pray with a boy who was dying and the nurse admitted to be touched by watching Whittle read the scriptures and not cuss. Here, in Major Whittle's own words, is what took place that night: "I dropped on my knees and held the boy's hand in mine. In a few broken words I confessed my sins and asked Christ to forgive me. I believed right there that He did forgive me. I then prayed earnestly for the boy. He became quiet and pressed my hand as I prayed and pleaded God's promises. When I arose from my knees, he was dead. A look of peace had come over his troubled face, and I cannot but believe that God who used him to bring me to the Savior, used me to lead him to trust Christ's precious blood and find pardon. I hope to meet him in heaven."

Ten years later, Dwight D. Moody, encouraged Major Whittle to enter evangelism. James McGranahan put music to many of Major Whittle's hymns, including I Know Whom I Have Believed. The chorus of the hymn is based on 2 Timothy 1:12, "...for I know whom I have believed, and am persuaded that he is able to keep that which I have committed unto him against that day."

I Know Whom I Have Believed was originally published in 1883 in Gospel Hymns No. 4. Major Wittle died on March 4, 1901, having written over 200 hymns. *I Know Whom I Have Believed* is one of Major Whittle's best known hymns, along with *There Shall Be Showers of Blessing*. Major Whittle also wrote under the pseudonym's El Nathan, Elias Nathan and W.W.D. *Blessings* ~ *Michael Bleau, Music Director musicianmichael@bellsouth.net*
